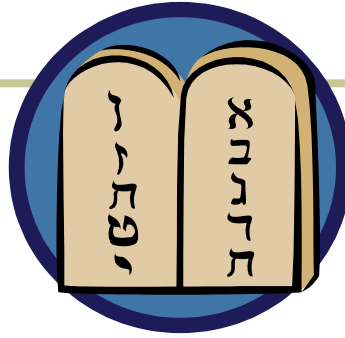

See Exodus 19:17 – 20:19; Luke 20:25–37; Matthew 22:34–40; Mark 12:28–34.

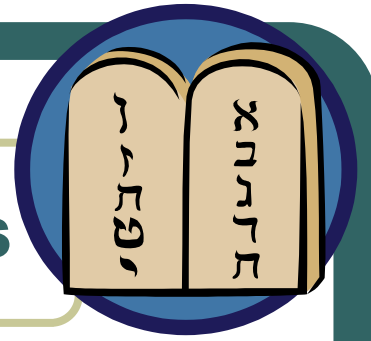
God gave Moses the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai so the Israelites could live in a harmonious community with one another.

Jesus replaced the Ten Commandments that God gave to Moses with two new commandments:

1. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your strength and with all your mind
2. And your neighbour as yourself.

Do these two commandments include all the rules in the Ten Commandments?

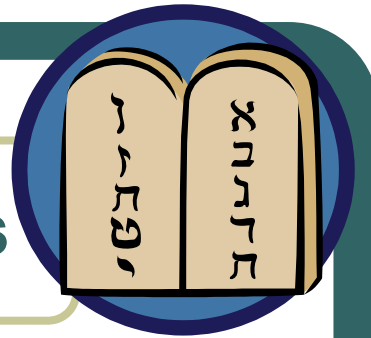
THE TEN COMMANDMENTS



The First Commandment

You shall have no other gods.

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS



The Second Commandment

**You shall not take the name
of the Lord your God in vain.**

1. You shall have no other gods.

What does this mean for us?

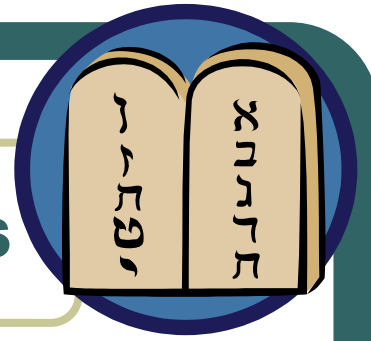
We are to fear, love, and trust God above anything else.

2. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.

What does this mean for us?

We are to fear and love God so that we do not use his name superstitiously, or use it to curse, swear, lie, or deceive, but call on him in prayer, praise, and thanksgiving.

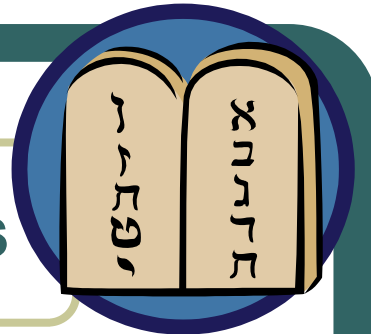

**Remember the Sabbath day,
to keep it holy.**

The Fourth Commandment

**Honour your father and
your mother.**

3. Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy.

What does this mean for us?

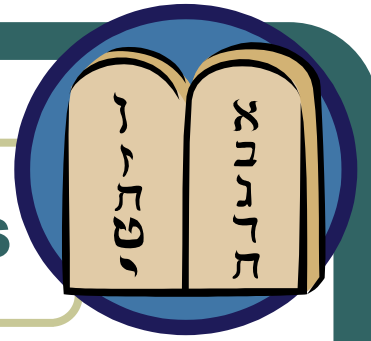
We are to fear and love God so that we do not neglect his Word and the preaching of it, but regard it as holy and gladly hear and learn it.

4. Honour your father and your mother.

What does this mean for us?

We are to fear and love God so that we do not despise or anger our parents and others in authority, but respect, obey, love, and serve them.

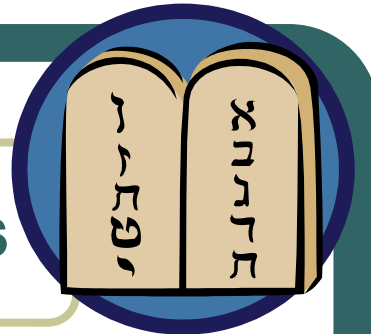

The Fifth Commandment

The Sixth Commandment

You shall not commit adultery.

What does this mean for us?

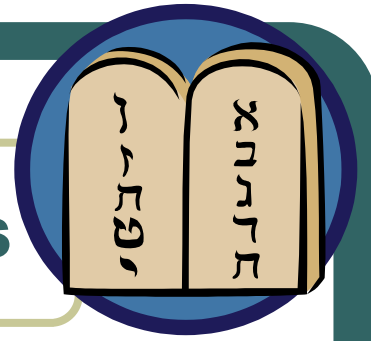
We are to fear and love God so that we do not hurt our neighbour in any way, but help him with all his physical needs.

6. You shall not commit adultery.

What does this mean for us?

We are to fear and love God so that in matters of sex our words and conduct are pure and honourable, and husband and wife love and respect each other.

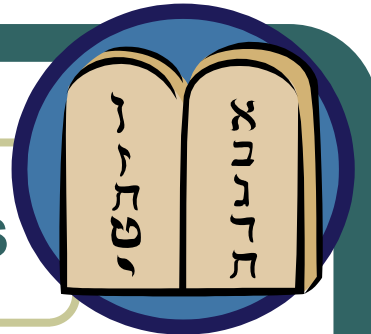

The Eighth Commandment

**You shall not bear false witness
against your neighbour.**

What does this mean for us?

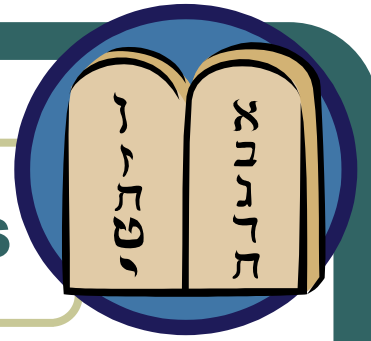
We are to fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbour's money or property, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his property and means of making a living.

8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour.

What does this mean for us?

We are to fear and love God so that we do not betray, slander, or lie about our neighbour, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain his actions in the kindest way.

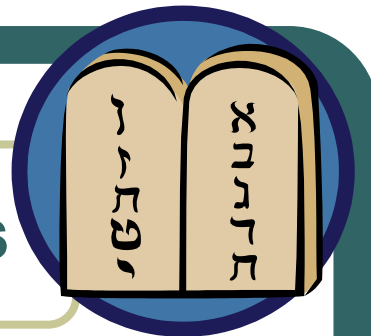

The Ninth Commandment

You shall not covet your neighbour's house.

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS



The Tenth Commandment

You shall not covet your neighbour's wife or his manservant or his maidservant or his cattle or anything that is your neighbour's.

9. You shall not covet your neighbour's house.

What does this mean for us?

We are to fear and love God so that we do not desire to get our neighbour's possessions by scheming or by pretending to have a right to them, but always help him keep what is his.

10. You shall not covet your neighbour's wife, or his manservant, or his maidservant, or his cattle, or anything that is your neighbour's.

What does this mean for us?

We are to fear and love God so that we do not tempt or coax away from our neighbour his wife or his workers, but encourage them to remain loyal.
